

Molly grew up as an only child in Sussex and trained as a hairdresser in her late teens, after which her career began.

It all changed when she fell in love with her husband, Heinz. They met after WW2 and married on the 14th August at the age of 19. Molly's father (who was a Chef in the Navy) proudly made their wedding cake. Soon after their nuptials, they relocated to Surrey to follow their passion for flowers.

At the height of their business, they owned 10 greenhouses in order to grow and sell daffodils, hyacinths, tulips and carnations in Covent Garden. The hustle and bustle of the city market made Molly feel energised.

In 1970, when they closed down their nursery, they moved to Ash and Heinz chose to work at the Badshot Lea Garden Centre until he was 82.

On their 60th wedding Anniversary they got a telegram from the Queen and then they went on a cruise to the Mediterranean. On their return, they were welcomed back by friends and family who had organised a garden party for all their loved ones – a family event that is fondly remembered.

Molly and Heinz were family people and they welcomed to the world a son, who gave them 4 grandchildren, who have also provided Molly with a further 5 great-grandchildren.

Bingo is a popular group activity we host every week. Residents enjoy chatting while playing and of course the prizes!





We're feeling the love while preparing for Valentine's Day here at Holly Lodge.






CONGRATULATIONS TO...

Chef's Seasonal Recipe Traditional Devon Cream Tea

<u>Ingredients</u> 900g Large Strawberries halved

to serve

Clotted Cream

Strawberry Conserve 900g small

strawberries 900g sugar

1 lemon juiced

Scones

450g Self-Raising

Flour

1.4 Tsp Salt

100g cold butter in

cubes

70g caster sugar 300ml Buttermilk

1 Tsp Vanilla Essence



Construction continues on Elm Lodge, the 5th Forest Care home. We hope to open the doors of the new luxury residential care home in Hartley Wintney in Spring 2023! Here is a sneak peek of the design.





Method

Strawberry Conserve

Place strawberries with sugar into a bowl; add the lemon juice, cover and leave to stand overnight. Next day, transfer the fruit and sugar to a pan, bring slowly to the boil and simmer for 5 minutes. Pour back into the bowl, cover and leave again for another day.

Finally, transfer to a preserving pan, bring to the boil and simmer until setting point is reached - this takes about 10 minutes. Remove from the heat and leave to cool a little. Stir once more to distribute the fruit evenly and pour into prepared hot sterilised jars and cover immediately.

Scones

Preheat the oven to 220°c.

In a large bowl rub together the flour, salt and butter until you get a fine breadcrumb consistency. Stir in the caster sugar. Pour the buttermilk and vanilla in a microwaveable bowl and heat for 30 seconds then pour into the flour. Mix with a knife then bring together with your hands into a soft dough. Place the dough on a floured surface, shape into a round, about 4cm thick and stamp out 8 scones using a 4cm cutter.

Place the scones on the baking tray, glaze with milk and bake for 10 minutes.

Let the scones cool slightly before splitting the scones with your hands and serving with strawberry conserve and clotted cream.
