Resident Profile





Alec Watts

Alec joined the Oak Lodge family in early 2021. He happily accepted to be our first resident profile for 2022 and has written his own beautiful story...

Born in London June 1927. Life growing up until just before the declaration of war in 1939 was normal and conventional. It all changed when I was evacuated to live with family in South Wales. Not the wisest of choices since the village lay midway between Cardiff and Barry Docks with it receiving more than its share of bombing. Admittedly the dropping of a large bomb in the middle of our allotment was welcomed, especially by all us youngsters that had been reluctantly toiling away in support of the Dig for Victory campaign.

I left school when 14 and started work in the Electrical Department of the Cardiff Electricity Board and attended the Cardiff Technical College. When 18, I was conscripted into the Army and sent to Brecon for initial training. This was followed by trade training in the Royal Signals, prior to being posted to Milan in Northern Italy.

There I was transferred to Air Formation Signals and spent the next two years working with RAF wings mainly in Northern Italy and Austria.

Aftermy service, I settled in London and immediately started work with the Telecom Company with whom I spent the next 42 years. Life was anything but mundane. I was privileged to work in a great variety of different workplaces. Notable subscribers such as the new John Lewis stores in Oxford Street and Milton Keynes, Fortnum and Masons Piccadilly, The Open University, The Royal Yacht Britannia, Ship Building Yards. Aircraft Manufacturing Factories, together with many large and small engineering and office businesses. Even bought a bespoke suit at cost price when working in Saville Row. No luck with Rolls Royce or Aston Martin though!

In 1963 I was transferred to Southampton with responsibilities for an area covering that City through the New Forest to Bournemouth and Poole.

Leisure time spent with a growing

family and outside pursuits was a very happy time. My wife and I joined the now defunct Civil Defence. We were members of the Rescue and First Aid Section and were trained in those disciplines. Our participation was serious but great fun as well. The Civil Defence had a great social side with dances, whist drives, race nights and a well-stocked bar!

1972 brought a final move to Basingstoke with work across the south. I retired in 1990 and over the course of the next 30 years, my Wife and I became active members of several clubs. We also ran a Rambling Group for 11 years, toured with a caravan for 19. and were keen wine makers. stamp collectors and with a love for reading and music. These activities together with the normal domestic and gardening tasks ensured that our days were busy and fulfilling. I count my blessings, and strongly believe in doing what one can, while one still can.



Chef's Seasonal Recipe Traditional Devon Cream Tea

Ingredients
900g Large
Strawberries halved

onawberries rialve

Clotted Cream

Strawberry Conserve

900g small strawberries 900g sugar 1 lemon juiced Scones

450g Self-Raising

Flour

1.4 Tsp Salt

100g cold butter in

cubes

70g caster sugar 300ml Buttermilk

1 Tsp Vanilla Essence



Construction continues on Elm Lodge, the 5th Forest Care home. We hope to open the doors of the new luxury residential care home in Hartley Wintney in Spring 2023! Here is a sneak peek of the design.





Method

Strawberry Conserve

Place strawberries with sugar into a bowl; add the lemon juice, cover and leave to stand overnight. Next day, transfer the fruit and sugar to a pan, bring slowly to the boil and simmer for 5 minutes. Pour back into the bowl, cover and leave again for another day.

Finally, transfer to a preserving pan, bring to the boil and simmer until setting point is reached - this takes about 10 minutes. Remove from the heat and leave to cool a little. Stir once more to distribute the fruit evenly and pour into prepared hot sterilised jars and cover immediately.

Scones

Preheat the oven to 220°c.

In a large bowl rub together the flour, salt and butter until you get a fine breadcrumb consistency. Stir in the caster sugar. Pour the buttermilk and vanilla in a microwaveable bowl and heat for 30 seconds then pour into the flour. Mix with a knife then bring together with your hands into a soft dough. Place the dough on a floured surface, shape into a round, about 4cm thick and stamp out 8 scones using a 4cm cutter.

Place the scones on the baking tray, glaze with milk and bake for 10 minutes.

Let the scones cool slightly before splitting the scones with your hands and serving with strawberry conserve and clotted cream.
